ASPRS Rio Grande Chapter Spring 2013 Scholarship

Purpose

The purpose of this award is to recognize and honor ONE UNDERGRADUATE and ONE GRADUATE New Mexico student for outstanding academic success, research potential, and commitment with respect to geospatial science and technology (e.g., photogrammetry, remote sensing, geographic information systems).

Eligibility

- The applicant must be a current student member of ASPRS.
- The applicant must be an undergraduate or graduate student currently enrolled in a college or university in New Mexico.
- The student must be pursuing a program of study that may lead to a career as a geospatial professional.

Award

The award consists of a certificate and a check in the amount of \$250 to be presented to each recipient at the Annual Spring Meeting of the ASPRS Rio Grande Chapter in Las Cruces on 6 April 2013.

Application Materials

A student who wishes to be considered for the award must submit an application form and the following items by 15 March 2013 to Joe Zebrowski ([jpezrowski@nmhu.edu](mailto:jpzebrowski@nmhu.edu)), current ASPRS-RGC President:

- An unofficial transcript documenting all college- and/or university-level courses completed and grades earned.
- A listing of geospatial courses taken.
- A statement, not to exceed 250 words, detailing the applicant's goals for a career as a geospatial professional.
- Materials demonstrating the applicant's research potential and commitment to geospatial science and technology (e.g. portfolio of class projects, poster or paper presentations, technical papers, internship reports, summary of pertinent volunteer activities).
- List of two references, including names, job titles, relationships, addresses, and phone numbers.

Award Selection

The Committee will be composed of geospatial professionals in New Mexico and will consider undergraduate and graduate applications separately. The applicant who, in the opinion of the majority of the Committee, has the highest overall ranking in each category (undergraduate/graduate) is designated as the winner in that category.
